Beware Licence Plate Sticker Thieves

While my car was in to have the front brakes renewed on Friday March 27th, one of the mechanics commented that someone had stolen my sticker. When I asked what he was talking about, he took me to the back of the car to show me where someone had removed my

newly applied February 2010 vehicle validation sticker.

Most of us simply clean off the surface of the previous sticker and put the new one on top of it. That way, all a thief has to do is to pry off the layered stack, clean up the back and glue your sticker onto their license plate, or worse, sell it to someone else to apply it to theirs. This allows them to avoid the need to bother about paying for an Emissions Test,

paying the renewal fee of \$74.00, or the new "Miller" private vehicle tax (only in Toronto) and, by extension, probably drive uninsured.

This time I scraped the sticker location completely clean of old stickers, washed the site with lighter fluid, and then applied the new one and rubbed it down well.

The lady that served us indicated that once the site is cleaned off and the new sticker is applied and well rubbed down, if you take a

sharp Exacto knife or something similar and score lines vertically and horizontally across the sticker, it guarantees that it can only be removed in small, useless pieces.

Whenever you replace your validation sticker my advice is to completely remove all traces of the old sticker(s) and follow the process above. At least then the thief will steal someone else's sticker.

Police Union Candidate for President has Checkered Past

TORONTO — The largest municipal police union in the country will be seeking a new leader after Toronto Police Association president Dave Wilson surprised his colleagues Tuesday by quietly announcing that he is leaving his post to head up the Brampton city government's bylaw-enforcement office.

An election to pick his replacement is expected in the fall.

First to throw his hat in the ring for Mr.

Wilson's job was Constable Michael McCormack of 51 Division, the son of former police chief William McCormack.

Until a new president is selected, day-to-day business will be run by vice-president Douglas Corrigan, who is expected to run again for the No. 2 job.

Constable McCormack ran against Mr. Wilson in 2006, losing by roughly 100 votes among the 3,900-plus ballots cast, and he promised Tuesday to be just as forceful.

Constable McCormack, 47, is a foot-patrol

officer on the city's east side, and a father of two adult children, aged 27 and 18.

And he, too, has had his differences with the brass.

In March, a Police Services Act charge of discreditable conduct, laid against him in connection with the secret tape-recording of *Toronto Star* reporter John Duncanson while Mr. Duncanson was in a jail cell two years ago, was withdrawn.

A police tribunal hearing for Constable McCormack was told there was no longer any reasonable prospect of conviction.

The tapes were allegedly made in a bid to learn who was leaking information to Mr. Duncanson, who had been writing about police corruption.

Constable McCormack still faces a charge of insubordination for allegedly using the police computer system to improperly look up Mr. Duncanson's background, with a trial date set for June 23.

On Tuesday, however, he predicted he would be vindicated.

Asked if he has confidence in the leadership of Chief Blair, he replied:

"I have questions about the police leadership. There's room for improvement anywhere, and I think there's things we can do with the management to make things better for everybody."
